Dear Parishioners, I once again draw your attention to the various activities we are fortunate to offer you for your spiritual/ intellectual/relational growth this Lent. Besides our pilgrimage to the Shrine of Mercy at Penrose Park (the bus is nearly full, so, please, if you would like to join us, sign up today), our inaugural Men's Lenten Retreat Day (inspired by the great success of our Women's Advent Retreat Day), Stations of the Cross (which had a solid turn out on Friday evening), I would now like to draw your attention to our "Lenten Lectures" for 2024. The theme for this year is **Christ**, **Catholicism**, & Controversy. The word "controversial" has become something of a buzz word in the media, often used as a convenient label for

those who diverge from, or challenge, mainstream narratives. However, the word quite literally means to be "turned against" and, in this sense, Jesus emerges as the most controversial person in history. Christ's paschal mystery signifies a turning against sin, darkness, and death making Him inherently controversial. Lent is a season where we, too, are all called to turn against sin and our own worldly attachments; prompting us, then, to become "more controversial". In a bid to explore this topic further, the format will be slightly different this year. Our first and fourth "lecture" will actually be a spiritual meditation on some of Jesus' most controversial words. The focus on these nights is not so much to listen to the talk as such, but rather to use the talk as a stimulus with which to pray about Jesus' words in front of the Blessed Sacrament. The hope is that we might move then to reconsider how — in this Lenten season — we might embrace the "controversy" in our own lives. The second and third "lecture" will be a talk on someone in the Church who was labelled "controversial" in recent years . Fr Noel will speak on the life of Saint Theresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein), a 20th century atheist and intellectual powerhouse who became a Catholic nun. I will speak on a person a little closer to home, the late George Cardinal Pell, arguably, the most controversial churchman Australia has ever produced. A number of parishioners have asked me to speak on this topic so now seemed an opportune time. I do hope you will all come along. God bless! Fr Greg

SAVE PALLATIVE CARE-SIGN THE **PETITION:** Archbishop Anthony Fisher writes "euthanasia and assisted suicide has been in operation in NSW for three months. I said at the time that its implementation was a very dark day for our state and that remains true. In the 2023-2024 NSW Budget, \$150 million was cut from the previously allocated budget for palliative care in this state. The flow on effect from fewer resources being allocated to palliative care is that fewer people will be able to access it. In the very same budget, almost \$100 million of new funding was allocated to the implementation of euthanasia and assisted suicide.
