Dear Parishioners, I greet you all with great joy; the joy of "Alleluia! Christ is truly risen." On behalf of Fr Noel, Daniel (our seminarian), and myself, may I wish you all a happy and holy Easter. This Easter is truly a time of extra-Easter-joy for our parish as we welcome eighteen of our brothers and sisters into the Catholic faith. 
