

Dear Parishioners, To those of you who have been enjoying time away during the school holidays, welcome back. I do hope you are feeling refreshed, spiritually rejuvenated, and excited about the new school term! It was wonderful to see another strong turn out for our ANZAC day Mass on Thursday. Catholicism, as I have said before, is the religion of memory. Remembering to give thanks to God and to pray for the repose of the soul of those courageous men and women who gave their lives for our freedom, is a most important tradition. Thank you to all those who assisted with the preparations for this Mass.

After a little bit of respite post-Easter triduum, the parish is gearing up for a plethora of different formation and outreach events. First and foremost, I would like to remind everyone of the fact that we have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Confession available every day

in our parish (with the exception of no Adoration on Mondays). A growing community is a praying community. God must come first! In this Eastertide season, perhaps we can all think of one way in which we can do something extra (on an ongoing basis) for our spiritual lives. It could be attending another Mass during the week; saying the rosary as a family; or coming to some means of formation. In terms of formation, Fr Noel will shortly commence a bible study series, which will run over five consecutive Thursdays. The first session is on Thursday 9th May between 7pm and 8pm. Building upon a number of prior events/activities, we will also launch a weekly gathering for young adults (aged 18-35), held every Wednesday night. There will be a mixture of intellectual formation, spiritual formation, and, of course, plenty of social events. Our first gathering will take place on Wednesday 22nd May at 7pm. I will give the first talk in a series that **addresses the topic of "Identity".** Further details will be provided in the coming weeks. To the men of the parish, there is a talk this Wednesday night by a guest speaker, Jim Jankiewicz, on "The Gift of Purity". The night begins with Adoration at 6:30pm followed by Mass. However, do come along to the dinner, which begins at 7:30pm if you cannot come earlier. To the women of the parish, please keep an eye out for a new formation series on the "feminine genius" being organised by our CWL branch. This is pitched for women of all ages. Finally (for now), the whole parish community is strongly encouraged to come to our annual Eucharistic Procession down Gymea Bay Road on Sunday 2nd June, following the 9:30am Mass. In order to promote greater devotion to the Eucharist, we are also hosting a two-week exposition — kindly funded by a most generous parishioner —, which, drawing inspiration from Blessed Carlos Acutis (1991-2006), will list various Eucharistic miracles that have occurred through the centuries.

As you can see, there is much happening so lets not take these opportunities for granted. I continue to encourage you to think of ways you might get more involved, spiritually and pastorally, in the life of the parish and strengthen the bonds of faith and family we all love and share. EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION/EXHIBITION: A crucial part of our mission to evangelise and re-evangelise Catholics and non-Catholics is to promote a love for Our Lord's Real Presence in the Eucharist. The Catechism of the Catholic Church quotes the definitive teaching of the Council of Trent, which summarises the Catholic faith by declaring: "Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread, it has always been the conviction of the Church of God, and this holy Council now declares again, that by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and **properly called transubstantiation."** Thanks to the wonderful initiative and generosity of a parishioner, we will host a very special exhibition that draws inspiration from Blessed Carlos Acutis documentation of various Eucharistic miracles. The images will be found along the back of the Church, beginning Sunday, 26 May through to Sunday, 9 June. Our annual Eucharistic Procession down Gymea Bay Road will, of course, be held on the Feast of Corpus Christ, Sunday, 2 June, following the 9:30 am Mass. Please mark your calendars now!

CHARITABLE WORKS FUND APPEAL: Please be advised that the parish will undertake Charitable Works Fund Appeals. CWF contributions are 100% tax deductible and support a plethora of the good works of the Archdiocese including: Catholic Care (our welfare agency); various hospital and university chaplaincies; the ministry to the deaf and hard of hearing; Aboriginal Catholic Ministry; and it also supports the cost of training our future priests (seminarians) as well as many other such works. The Archdiocese requires that every parish conduct this appeal three times a year and every parish is given a specific "quota" (a numerical-financial goal), which reflects the income/socio-economic capacities of that parish. Our quota this quarter is close to \$23,000. Whatever we do not raise has to be paid out of the parish account. Envelopes will be available throughout the month of May but we will officially take up the appeal on the Weekend of the 4th and 5th May. I thank you wholeheartedly for your generosity and for your love and support of our parish.
